BOURNE IN BLOOM

The Judges Visited Bourne on Monday 4th July. The Award Ceremony will be held in Leicester in September



The naming ceremony took place at Beryl Mews and Sellwood Terrace on the Larkfleet Homes Old Laundry development. The development was named after HMS Beryl and its Commander Harry Sellwood. The warship was funded during Warships Week in 1942 by the people of Bourne, and raised £55,000. The naming ceremony was conducted by The Rev Douglas Clarke and members of the Bourne branch of the Royal Naval Association. Attending the ceremony by invitation from the Royal Naval Association were members of the Harry Sellwood family. The Town Mayor Brenda Johnson, representatives from Bourne Civic Society and South Kesteven District Council. Members of Royal Naval Association formed a guard of honour. Robert Manning School pupil John Hughes played The Last Post. After the ceremony the family of Commander Sellwood visited The Heritage Centre to see the plaques, certificates and history of HMS Beryl and the ships commander Harry Sellwood. Bert Johns a member of the Royal Naval Association compiled the history of HMS Beryl and put forward to the Town Council to name the development Beryl Mews and Sellwood Terrace.

On Tuesday 5th July Carlos Jalife and a group of Mexicans visited Baldocks Mill /Heritage Centre where they had refreshments and then were given a guided tour by chairman Brenda Jones and member Peter Putterill, also at the mill were Jim Jones Tony Burke and an ex BRM designer Geoff Harmston. The group were delighted to view the trophies won by their hero Pedro, in the Raymond Mays Room. In the cabinet there are eight trophies won by Pedro Rodriguez they are the Spanish Grand Prix Formula 1 at Barcelona in 1971 when he came 4th, the Austrian World Masters Formula 1 at Osterriehring in 1970 (4th), the Austrian Grand Prix at Graz in 1970 (4th – silver cup and salver), the Austrian Grand Prix at Spielberg in 1970 (4th), the Austrian World masters championships at Osterriehring in 1970 (4th), the Spanish Grand Prix Formula 1 at Montjuich in 1971 (4th), the Belgian Grand Prix in 1970 (1st).

Pedro Rodriguez

Pedro Rodriguez born in Mexico City 1940. He raced bicycles and motorcycles along with his brother and became a Mexican champion in 1953. In 1957 he made his international debut in racing cars. When living in England he liked to live the life of an English man. He would wear a deerstalker hat and liked English food, but he would always put Tabasco sauce on the food to liven it up. He lived in Bray Berkshire in his latter years. Pedro Rodriguez was killed in an InterSerie sports car at Norisringi in Nuremberg, Germany, on 11th July, at the wheel of a Ferrari 512M.
